Admission requirements	Membership of Blind Veterans UK - to qualify for support
	from Blind Veterans UK, you need to meet two criteria:
	Military service. Served in either: The UK regular Armed Forces, including the UK reserve Armed Forces or National Service.
	 As a reservist, you need to have completed at least one year's satisfactory service after training (qualified for bounty) or less time if blinded on duty Served during WW2 in the Merchant Navy, or in Polish/Indian forces under British command.
	2) Sight loss. To meet our ophthalmic criteria an applicant needs to present with visual acuities in both eyes which are equal to (or worse than) 6/60 or counting fingers.
Summary	Our Centre is first and foremost a rehabilitation centre for visually impaired veterans. It offers care as part of the lifelong support we provide to our members who are aged in their 20's with many now over 100. The Centre offers a wide range of activities tailored to our Members needs including themed holidays.
