WE HAVE widened our outreach services to reach even more veterans across East Lancashire, Rochdale, Middleton and Heywood areas.

At our annual general meeting it was reported that from April 2018-19 more than 200 outreach sessions had been held, but that figure is set to increase.

Building on the success of the newly opened drop in shop in Accrington, we have now launched a further drop in café in Billington to serve Ribble Valley.


An extra outreach at Middleton Gardens is complemented by a Coffee Club at 'The Lighthouse Project' in the shopping centre and in Pendle, outreach will be available at Colne's Asda and Nelson's Morrisons.

Chief Executive Amanda Walton said: "The new venues will enable VIC to expand our services into some of the more remote areas of our catchment.

"None of this would be possible without our many volunteers who work alongside our Outreach Workers and Project Workers and we offer them all huge thanks."

FURNITURE donated by Haslingden home furnishings company Clark & Clark has brightened up the back room of our Hyndburn shop.

The shop, which opens on Tuesdays and Fridays as a drop-in in Accrington Arndale Centre, is still proving extremely popular and the relocated art group has been buzzing.

Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "We are getting new people coming in every week and they are very supportive. We have helped a number of veterans to complete paperwork so they can get the veterans' badge and also helped them apply for the defence discount card.

"Others wanted to know how to obtain their service records, or the records of relatives. A lot come in just to look at the paintings and we now have a display of beautiful walking sticks made by VIC member Dave Almond."

OUR well attended annual general meeting heard that more than 200 outreach sessions had been delivered by VIC in the last year.

At the VIC Centre in Haslingden, Liz Hamilton outlined a host of achievements for the charity in her last AGM before resigning from the post.

Liz said: "From April 2018 to March 2019 we had 175 new members who completed membership forms.

"We have also carried out more than 50 outreach home visits to those who were unable to attend our centre or an outreach session."

The charity successfully provided students on the National Citizen Service programme with experience and also brought the armed forces to life for students on Military Preparation and Public Services Courses.

Liz described the peer support offered by VIC as the 'golden thread' as it is delivered to veterans by veterans who are able to learn from their own personal experiences to help others.

She said: "Partnerships are also really important. It is important that agencies understand what a veteran is and ask the right questions, and that they understand why they may not get the full story from a veteran at first because of their past and background."

Chairman Ronnie Barker stressed the vital role volunteers played in the success of VIC – and totalled up that, if they were paid a minimum wage, the annual cost would be nearly £33k.

The charity is well supported by donations, fundraising and money raised by the VIC Choir, which mostly sings in supermarkets, was more than £4,500.

A successful fundraising ceilidh was held and sponsored personal challenges were carried out by Julie Davis, the daughter of VIC member John



Edwards. Liz stressed the organisation had been so successful because, besides the seven staff members, it has a huge team of volunteers who worked together.

Lancashire County Council Armed Forces Champion County Councillor Alf Clempson attended and formally presented the Tom Davies Trophy, which was awarded to the charity in the summer.

He said: "The biggest challenge to a lot of service charities and groups is longevity. It is wonderful to see how this

group has achieved it through its great volunteers but it is also important to have a good Chief Executive Officer to steer it."

Liz was quick to point out VIC's success was down to the team including trustees, staff and volunteers.

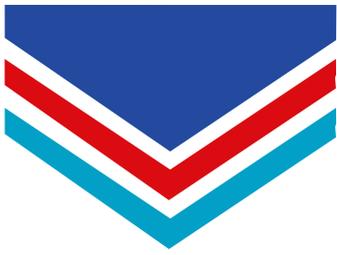
She added: "I couldn't have done my job for the last four years without the rest of you. Thank you for a lovely four years."

VIC secured a grant of almost £10,000 from the National Lottery Awards for All to cover the cost of new tools specifically for the manufacturing project, volunteer expenses and a structured training project.

Bernard Tighe, who has been volunteering with VIP for about six months, has been chosen to lead the project.

He said: "Being a part of VIP has got me out of the house and stopped me

vegetating. I am a bit of a 'Bob the builder' and whatever needs making I can do it. In my new role I want to expand the range of items VIP makes as well as pass on my skills and teach others."

Bernard served in the Royal Air Force from 1976 to December 1987 and was based on Harriers and served on detachment all over the world.

He said: "After I left, I was building microlights and then I went on to build scale models of planes – including one with a 23ft wing span.

"I have been stuck in a rut for 20 years



and although I tinker a lot, really it is just me and my rescue animals."

He said he was looking for more veterans to get involved with VIP and is also offering opportunities to students to learn new skills. Grace Codd

volunteered with VIP after attending a placement at the charity while she was on a course at North Lincs Training. The skills she learnt enabled her to get a full-time joinery job.


