Lest we forget

RESTRICTIONS impacted on a number of Remembrance services around the VIC area, but we were able to meet at Haslingden's Memorial Gardens on Armistice Day.

A short service was led by VIC Administrator Amy Thompson, who is also volunteer secretary of the Haslingden branch of The Royal British Legion. Chief Executive Amanda Walton laid a wreath

on behalf of VIC.

The Last Post was played, Operations Manager Bob Elliott lowered the Union Flag and two minutes' silence was observed.

VIC donated two large First World War silhouette soldiers which stand guard over the memorial at Greenfield Gardens during Remembrance and Armistice.

The service was attended by many members of VIC, local police and even lorry drivers parked up their wagons and joined the service to

pay respects.

Project Worker Ray Sharkey lowered the flag on Remembrance Sunday.

Thank you to Rossendale Council for providing two new Union Flags for the Haslingden flagpole. One will fly all year round and one will be kept for special occasions.

A short Remembrance service was also held at the cenotaph in Bacup Cemetery led by VIC member Bill

Ogden.

Also in attendance were Mick Armstrong and Tracy Keir.

Tracy said: "We were going to get a wreath from The Royal British Legion, but as parades have been cancelled they were not available.

"My friend Jan Meadowcroft suggested contacting Kate Lea, who works for Rolands Florists, as she had been

making ribbon wreaths. She agreed to make a larger version and donated it to local veterans."

Bill said: "Ever since VIC carried out Project 100 to mark the graves and remembrance stones to First World War soldiers in the cemetery, we have held a special service on the Friday before Remembrance Sunday.

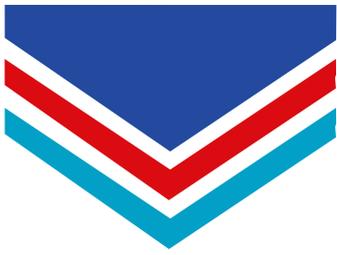
A BIG thank you to jewellery maker Gill Currie who donated £40 to VIC as a result of sales of her products throughout the month of October.

Silhouette soldiers raise £1k

SILHOUETTE soldiers and pyrography window hangings specially created for Remembrance helped

raise more than £1,000.
VIC members created the memorial tributes, which sold out quickly.



Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "In total 55 pyrography wall hangings were made, 40 window statues of different sizes and three larger garden silhouette statues.

"They were a huge success so we will be going into production much earlier next year in order to meet the demand."

Veteran Brian McEvoy designed and created the pyrography and Sessional Worker Bernard Tighe, who runs Veterans In Production, led the manufacture of the silhouette statues; they were helped by Emma Jane Petherbridge, Ray Sharkey and Joe Davis.

A donation was also made to The Royal British Legion.

Santa helps raise profile

VULNERABLE veterans are being offered accommodation at a new development in Middleton.

The Limes is a development of nine one-bedroom flats close to the town centre.

Myspace Housing Solutions is accepting referrals from veterans aged over 18, with a vulnerability, with or without children. They must be in receipt of a long-term benefit, without job seeking obligations, and must require tenancy-related support.

WE CURRENTLY have 25 tablets out on loan to veterans across our outreach areas thanks to Veterans Should Not Be Forgotten – an Armed Forces Covenant grant.

When government restrictions allowed, we held IT training sessions in person at the centre and also at The Sandbag Cafe. We have also now set up Zoom groups.

Outreach Worker Steve Butterworth supports members in Pendle and Rochdale and Project Worker Bev Fowler looks after those in Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale. Philip Chamberlain is responsible for Burnley and Project Worker Ray Sharkey looks after Hyndburn, Ribble Valley and Rossendale.

Group Zoom meetings are being held in the areas so that contact can be maintained




over lockdown and whatever tier restrictions are introduced in December.

Ray said: "The purpose of these meetings is to have some interaction hopefully on a weekly basis where we have some form of face-to-face contact with each other, be that just for a laugh, a virtual breakfast club or anything welfare related."

VIC managed to get a computer class started at Heywood's The Sandbag Café, before the second lockdown and, as soon as permitted, further invitation-only sessions will be held.
