VIC lands key role

WE ARE delighted to announce that VIC has been selected to be part of the delivery of an exciting new Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust programme.

Nationally, £9million has been awarded to the Veterans' Places, Pathways and People Programme which will be delivered by four national strategic projects and a further 10 regional projects, one apiece in Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales and seven in England in the Op Courage areas.

In the North West, Broughton House in Trafford is the portfolio lead, with the Armed Forces HQ at Wigan partnering to manage the programme.

Sub-groups will be delivering the different aspects of the programme and VIC will be advising

and supporting veteran organisations in Lancashire and South Cumbria areas about social prescribing – the 'Places' aspect of the programme.

VIC Chief Executive Amanda Walton said: "VIC has been recognised as being an exemplar place for veterans to come to and receive support.

"It is an honour that our charity has been chosen to be a key player in the delivery of such a prestigious project.

"Our task will be to develop a social prescribing toolkit and to develop a toolkit to support pop-up safe places for veterans in remote locations so that they can engage and connect with other sub-groups.

"We will be offering guidance and support to other organisations across Lancashire and South Cumbria

"We have benefited from having support from the East Lancashire NHS Clinical Commissioning Group right from the start of VIC, because we have been able to prove the worth of what we do, we are properly governed and accountable."

VIC has been awarded £35k over two years from the programme and a further member of staff will be employed.

2021 review



HERE are the main highlights of our activities and news from 2021.

As a result of the global pandemic, our usual activities and events were impacted considerably.

However, we never stopped working and VIC was just as busy and continued to develop and grow.

MARSHALLING

For the first five months of 2021, VIC provided Covid marshals for the Rawtenstall and Acorn Centre Vaccination Hubs. We had more than 40 volunteers covering more than 50 days on split shifts in all weather conditions.

A conservative estimate is that our volunteer members gave more than 4,000 hours of their own time to ensure the rollout of the vaccine was successful.

TABLETS

Using the funding from the Veterans Should Be Forgotten Project we loaned out a number of tablets to our members and some with internet access, so that they could keep in contact with families and friends and take part in our virtual groups including The Sandbag Café, The Mess Tin, Art Groups, Choir, and Bob Ross art classes.

DROP IN

At the end of April, the VIC Centre and the Accrington veteran's drop-in were able to open again for some group activities and for other organisations to see their clients.

SHORTLISTED

During 2021 we were shortlisted in The Pathfinder International Armed Forces Community Lockdown Awards, and also finalists in the Rossendale Business Awards.

CELEBRATION

We celebrated our volunteers during the Small Charity Week and Volunteers' Week in June for their support during the Covid crisis and their support during 2020. Our volunteers and members are the key to our continued growth and to running our activities.

ARMED FORCES WEEK

During Armed Forces Week in June, we took our van on a Road Show to Heywood, Haslingden and Clitheroe. We launched the Ribble Valley dropin at the same time and at Accrington we decorated the drop-in. Unfortunately restrictions meant we couldn't attend an event in Burnley.

On one of the free days, we invited our core volunteers to a BBQ at the centre in Haslingden.

BREAKFAST

In addition to Heywood's The Sandbag Café, Middleton's The Mess Tin and Burnley FC in the Community Breakfast Club, we started supporting Blackburn Rovers with their new Veterans' Breakfast Club in September.

PROJECTS

Our members helped with some Community Projects in 2021; Whitaker Park, The Sabre Challenge, Mulberry Roots and Haslingden Community Link.

RECYCLING

Veterans In Production made bespoke garden furniture using pallets donated by JJO.

TRIPS AWAY

Our members took part in some social trips: Harrogate Army College, Bolton Abbey and to the National Arboretum.

OP RETURN

In October we opened the centre and 'Operation Return' was a great success with around 100 members, volunteers and people from the community dropping in throughout the afternoon and evening.

VIC CHOIR

Unfortunately, our Choir was unable to perform live during 2021 due to Covid, apart from a performance at Asda in Rawtenstall for Christmas.

SILHOUETTES

Veterans In Production produced a new silhouette for Remembrance, it was a 'We Salute You' soldier. In 2022 we will produce a different figure.

REMEMBRANCE

Our members and volunteers attended many Remembrance services and parades in 2021.

In 2020 they had to be cancelled, but in 2021 many were able to go ahead as planned. Our main reception has been changed thanks to a donation of a large Poppy and Book of Remembrance.
