Brenda MacKay our Horticultural Therapist at Gardening Leave Erskine started work at the beginning of August and by the end of the month, Tara Jeewoonarain our Horticultural Therapist at Gardening Leave Chelsea had also joined the team!

Brenda and her ever-growing team of volunteers have been getting the 'old' garden centre ready for the first veterans and in September, she delivered 55 half day sessions of Horticultural Therapy to 9 different veterans. As the veterans are being referred by several different referral agencies, it is taking time to build up relationships with each one but the word is spreading and we have been made very welcome by Jim Panton and the staff and residents at Erskine Hospital.

We are very fortunate that Kate Gould, a garden designer who has won numerous medals at RHS shows including Gold at Chelsea has agreed to be our first Champion and she will help to raise the profile of Gardening Leave in the horticultural world.

### Mental Health Foundation.

The external evaluation which is being conducted at both sites by the Mental Health Foundation over a 2 year period will begin in November. This will evaluate Cost effectiveness, Wellbeing and Mental Health symptoms and will be another stepping stone in our quest to establish Gardening Leave as a viable therapeutic intervention which improves the mental and physical wellbeing of ex-Service personnel.

### The Future.

As Gardening Leave's profile grows and more people find out about what we do and how we are helping veterans to adjust to civilian life, we will continue to open new Gardening Leave sites where veterans can be together, be outside and have something semi-structured to do under the watchful eye of a Horticultural Therapist who is supported by volunteers.

All this costs money and on behalf of all the veterans who know about Gardening Leave and those who have yet to find us, Thank You to the Friends, Partners and Funders who help to keep the show on the road by giving us their support – we literally couldn't exist without you!

### VETERANS ATTENDANCE AT GARDENING LEAVE

Over 200 have received Horticultural Therapy at Gardening Leave since we started in April 2007 and over 70% choose to come back.


